


MARKS AND MOTIFS: PRINTS FROM THE PCA COLLECTION

31 August - 21 October 2007

A QUT Art Museum Travellina Exhibition celebrating the 40th Anniversary of the Print Council of Australia (PCA), Marks and Motifs consists of 45 works commissioned by the PCA since the 1960s.

The exhibition gives an insight into the historical development of printmaking in Australia, particularly with the recent emergence of new print technologies (including photomechanical and digital processes) and the effects this has had on more traditional methods such as linocut and woodcut.

This exhibition is supported by Visions of Australia, an Australian Government Program supporting touring exhibitions by providing funding assistance for the development and touring of cultural material across Australia.



Saturday 17 and Sunday 18 November: 10am - 4pm

This workshop aims to add to participant's current drawing skills by raiding the best of what science can offer in the realm of experimentation. 'In the Lab...' allows participants to place the complex of ideas that cause one to draw in a particular way 'under a microscope'. These ideas will be dissected to allow participants a greater consciousness of what motivates them in their drawing.

The workshop will introduce participants to other starter ideas (or hypotheses) that will enhance both skill and expressive development. Each approach will be 'tested', similar to how scientists test various theories, through drawing practice and peer review. A high volume of drawings come out of each session giving participants a highly graphical journey and material to extend progress into the future.



ARTISTS' BOOKS, TATE ADAMS READING ROOM

To celebrate the opening of Artspace Mackay in February 2003, artist Tate Adams generously donated over three hundred works on paper, artists' books, wood blocks and reference books to the Mackay City Council Collection.

This major donation significantly enhanced an already impressive artists' books' collection established in 1995 by Mackay City Library. It also served to reinforce Artspace Mackay's profile as an important cultural landmark in the region. Since then, the Mackay City Council Art Collection has continued to grow and expand.

The artists' book collection is available for viewing by appointment, in the Tate Adams Reading Room or through *Meet the Collection*, 11am, first Sunday of each month.

THE PIONEER POTTERS COLLECTION

The Pioneer Potters, Mackay, was formed in 1975 by a small group of potters who wished to improve their skills. The underlying aim of the group was to have a contact area for aspiring ceramicists and to improve the standard of pottery in Mackay. This was accomplished by holding seminars and workshops with experienced potters from around Australia and overseas.

The Pioneer Potters established annual acquisitive awards that attracted entries from local, national and international artists. This collection was built up over a number of years and features prizewinning entries, as well as exceptional pieces acquired from visiting artists and workshop participants. In 2006, the Pioneer Potters Inc. generously donated the entire collection of 64 pieces to Mackay City Council.
