# WELCOME to Artspace Mackay

After a very successful first half-year programme, I am very pleased to present the second 2011 six month programme of the exhibitions and events at Artspace Mackay.

Numerous exhibitions and events are planned for Artspace and other venues throughout the region as part of the Mackay Festival of the Arts in July. The McAleese Gallery at Artspace will feature the major Queensland Art Gallery touring exhibition *Contemporary Miniatures* – a beautiful exhibition of miniature paintings from South Asia drawn from the Queensland Art Gallery Collection. Other exhibitions are planned for Artspace, the Town Hall, Sarina Art Gallery, Mirani Library and Gargett Gallery as well as a return of the popular Artspace Volunteers community art project, *Artstreet*.

More major exhibitions planned for Artspace this year include *Batik of Java: Poetics and Politics* combining a collection of contemporary batiks from Java with recent work by the major Indonesian/Australian artist Dadang Christanto inspired by his memory of Batiks from his childhood. In October, we are dedicating the McAleese Gallery to the children of the Region with an exhibition of *Alison Lester's Kids Antarctic Project*; illustrations inspired by childrens' drawings sent to her while on an Artist in Residence Fellowship at the Australian base in Antarctica. A second exhibition in the gallery will feature self portraits by students from schools through the region, exhibited with a group of self portraits by students from Mackay's Sister City, Matsuura, Japan. At the same time we will be exhibiting the second Artspace Foundation postcard exhibition *Subject Matters*.

The final major exhibition for the year is *Colliding Islands* – an exhibition that explores the idea of contemporary landscapes through the work of five international contemporary artists working in a range of artforms, including DVD projection and installation. The sole Australian exhibitor is Brisbane based indigenous artist, Archie Moore.

I hope you enjoy this second varied programme for 2011.

# ARTSPACE MACKAY GALLERIES AND SPACES



## Exhibition Galleries

Artspace Mackay encompasses three impressive exhibition spaces: McAleese Gallery; Cox Rayner Gallery & Artspace Mackay Foyer.

These state-of-the-art facilities ensure residents and visitors to Mackay are provided with the opportunity to see art exhibitions by significant international, Australian and local artists, as well as touring exhibitions presented by Australia's largest art galleries and museums.

## Artspace Mackay Seminar Room

The Seminar Room is Artspace Mackay's main in-house facility for workshops and presentations. Artspace's regular programs for children including Kids Art Club, BMA Kidspace and Kids Holiday Workshops are all held in the Seminar Room.

The room is set up for workshops, seminars and presentations by businesses and community groups, accommodating up to 40 people in a classroom/lecture style, and up to 25 people in table/seated format.

## Tate Adams Reading Room

Artspace Mackay's *Tate Adams Reading Room* provides an ideal quiet space for visitors to sit and read from its broad, contemporary art reference book collection. The purpose-designed reading room is also the storage space for Mackay Regional Council's extensive and significant collection of artists books. It is here that artists books are brought out for small groups of visitors to explore, research and enjoy.

The art reference book collection is an excellent resource for students and teachers. It is stored within the Artspace offices and visitors may transfer books into the reading room to read and research upon request.





## CONTEMPORARY MINIATURES

McAleese Gallery, Artspace Mackay

A collection-based exhibition drawn from the Queensland Art Gallery's holdings of miniature paintings from South Asia, *Contemporary Miniatures* explores the dynamic visual language of miniature painting and its continued importance in contemporary art practice. A significant thread in the exhibition is the citing of imagery, texts and events from the past to contextualise and comment on contemporary issues. This is a Queensland Art Gallery travelling exhibition, supported by the Visual Arts and Crafts Strategy, an initiative of the Australian, State and Territory Governments, administered by Arts Queensland.

## BONNEY BOMBACH MEMENTO MORI: TREE OF LIFE

Artspace Mackay Foyer

In an deeply poignant year for the artist, Bombach salvages memories from her family home. Honouring her late centenarian parents, refugees from 1938 Vienna, the photographs, letters and pieces she recovered not only translate as a remarkably personal genealogy, but act also as a symbol of permanence and transition. From the Latin phrase meaning a reminder of mortality, *Memento Mori* embodies a rich generational and spiritual connection.

## BLUEWATER TRAIL PUBLIC ART

Mackay

A public art information and location map detailing these groundbreaking works is available now at Artspace Mackay & Mackay Regional Council locations.

Mackay Regional Council and Artspace Mackay proudly present one of the most significant public art developments in Australia - six art installations by Fiona Foley highlight the Bluewater Trail beside Mackay's beautiful Pioneer River. Fiona Foley is amongst Australia's most experienced public art makers and this commission for Mackay sees a regional city earn its place on the world map for contemporary public art. Foley's research and discussions with local communities in the Mackay region, the Indigenous Yuibera people and the Mackay-based South Sea Islander communities, inform and infiltrate these works. Her incorporation of local indigenous narratives, their exploration of some of the difficult histories of Mackay, has brought air and recognition to the dispossessed.

Foley was awarded this commission in 2008, the year of the Apology to the Stolen Generations from the Rudd Government. These works are prominent in Mackay, visible along the riverfront to both pedestrian and vehicular traffic in Mackay's city centre. It is expected that they continue to relate narratives past, present, and to become part of the future to those both local and visiting in one of Australia's most vital and growing cities.

## HAPPILY EVER AFTER: ALTERNATIVE DESTINIES IN CONTEMPORARY FEMININE NARRATIVE

29 July - 28 October

*Happily Ever After* was conceived as an interdisciplinary collaboration between artists, writers and craftspeople invited to work together to create handmade books which explore female narratives within the fairytale genre.

While the classic fairytale ending 'happily ever after' envisages a single, finite destiny, the contemporary feminine experience encompasses a multiplicity of roles, expectations, endings, beginnings and relationships. Thus the exhibition theme is probably best conceptualised as a celebration of diversity within destiny, with the fairytale genre used as the narrative vehicle to explore this idea.

## BATIK OF JAVA: POETICS AND POLITICS

McAleese Gallery

On the 2nd October, 2009 UNESCO recognised Javanese batik as an item of *Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity*. To celebrate this, Caloundra Regional Gallery brings together two batik collections: one of batiks from the North Coast of Java and the other now held as memory and represented in the recent paintings by contemporary Indonesian artist Dadang Christanto (now resident in Brisbane). An element of these paintings depicts as fragments of memory and loss, batiks from the collection of his mother's shop. The selection of batiks from the Sunshine Coast collection of Greg Roberts and Ian Reed includes exquisite examples of North Coast Javanese textiles. *Batik of Java* is a Caloundra Regional Gallery touring exhibition.

## ALISON LESTER'S KIDS ANTARCTIC PROJECT

McAleese Gallery

In 2005, Alison Lester traveled to the Antarctic as an Australian Antarctic Arts Fellow. Thousands of children from schools all around the world were inspired, using her on-line diary and photographic journal to track her journey. By keeping in touch with Alison, children followed her trip, leaving Tasmania on the ice breaker Aurora Australis, to travel to Mawson Station and to Casey station on the Antarctic continent and sub-Antarctic Macquarie Island. Alison encouraged the students to draw in response to her descriptions and photos and on her return home she was inundated with beautiful drawings of Antarctica as imagined by children. Alison used these illustrations to complete this exhibition of work combining the children's line drawings with her design and colour.

Artspace Mackay Foyer

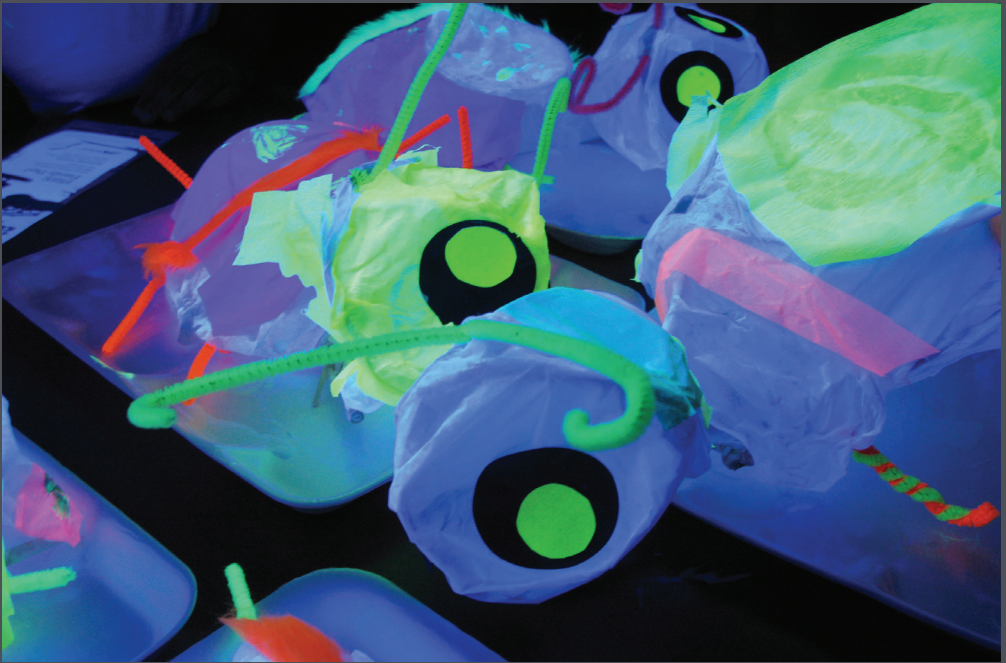

## FLOOR TALKS

Artspace Mackay floor talks are usually held at the beginning of exhibition season, and are free for anyone in the region to attend.

Floor talks are usually delivered by the artist or curator of the exhibition and offer participants insight into the work on show in both the McAleese Gallery and the Artspace Mackay Foyer. Your participation in the floor talk and discussion is invited and encouraged.

Artspace Mackay are also pleased to offer **Audio Floor Talks** on MP3 players to enhance your gallery visit. If you're unable to make it to the scheduled floor talks, you'll be pleased to know that, where possible, Artspace Mackay now records them for all to enjoy. You simply borrow an MP3 player, headphones and map of works from the front desk.

## MEET THE COLLECTION

The Artspace Mackay *Meet the Collection* program is designed to bring locals and visitors closer to the Mackay Regional Council Collection. Artspace Mackay houses an extensive collection of more than 600 artists' books and prints of national significance.

*Meet the Collection* is a 'white gloves' opportunity for visitors to handle the artists books the way the artists intended. It's also an ideal opportunity for people of the Mackay Region to explore and learn from a growing collection that belongs to them.

## GALLERY TOURS

Free gallery tours are available upon request for each exhibition at Artspace Mackay. Viewings of selections from the artists books collection, held in the Tate Adams Reading Room, can also be arranged. Tours aim to include content that will meet your group's needs and complement teaching and learning programs. For example, you may wish to combine a viewing of the artists book collection with a guided tour of an exhibition. Gallery tours are available on the hour, from Tuesday to Friday between 10am and 3pm (Artspace Mackay is closed Mondays).

A minimum of 15 days notice is required to secure a guide's services for tours and viewings of the artists book collection, so plan ahead for your visit. To book a gallery tour and/or viewing of the artists books collection, contact Artspace 4961 9722.



## ARTSPACE MACKAY COMMUNITY EXHIBITION PROGRAM

The Community Exhibitions Program managed by Artspace Mackay provides local artists with opportunities to exhibit their work. There are two community exhibition spaces in the region, Mackay Town Hall Studio and Sarina Art Gallery.

**Mackay Town Hall** is situated at 63 Sydney Street in Mackay's central business district. The studio space is well positioned for local artists or artist groups wishing to exhibit their work.

**Sarina Art Gallery** is located in the Field of Dreams Parkland, just off the highway in Sarina. It is a small exhibition space that is ideal for local artists and artist groups.

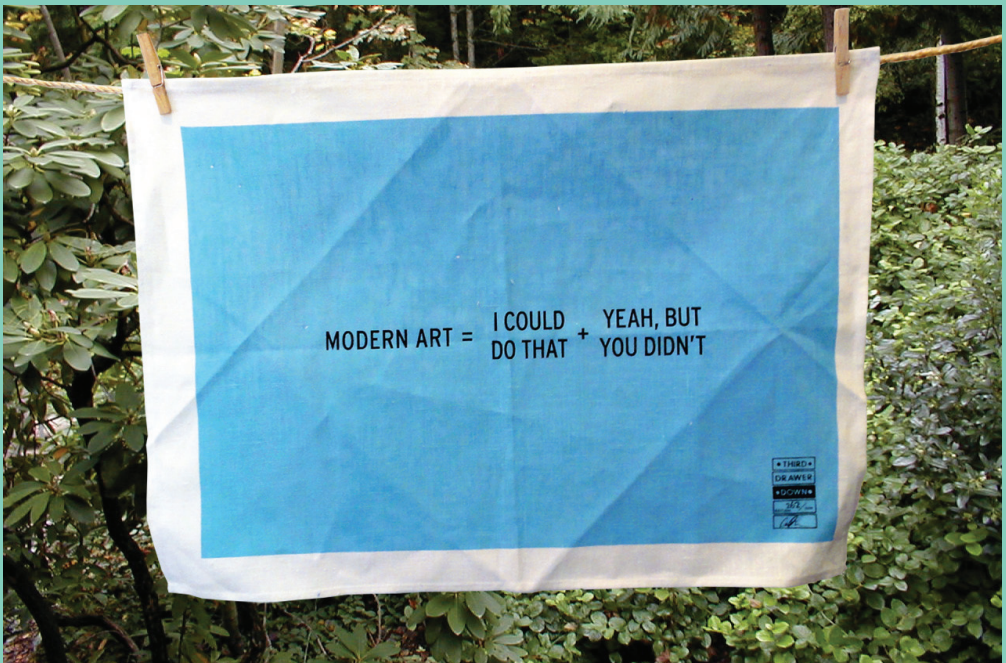
Would you like to further your knowledge in art and join an exciting team?
