Happy Birthday to us!

This year, Artspace Mackay turns twenty, and to celebrate our coming of age, we're bringing you a whole series of special, inhouse curated exhibitions, programs, and events that pay tribute to local creatives past, present, and emerging.

For over thirty-five years Arthur and Carol Rosser created work from their secluded rainforest pottery studio in the Mackay hinterland region of Eungella. The Rosser's artistic careers saw them quietly gain national recognition for their dedication to woodfiring. The retrospective exhibition *Fire and Ash* celebrates their prolific pottery practice and dedication to restorative and sustainable land care.

In Bloom celebrates the growth of Artspace Mackay over twenty years, considering the way floral imagery is used by artists to convey and interrogate a range of issues. It will present an exciting new major birthday commission by north Queensland artist Brian Robinson, alongside historic artworks and non-acquisitive commissions connecting to important stories from our region.

Dylan Mooney returns to Artspace this year to participate in our artist-in-residence program *The Wall*. This time, Dylan draws on his Torres Strait Islander heritage in a response to rising sea levels and the impact on island communities, extending on his recent advocacy for climate action.

A partnership with the incredible community arts organisation Crossroad Arts, *Time of Our Lives* is a digital animation project that ponders how we mark special occasions, and how the seasons and nature reflect the passing of time. Facilitated by local new media artist Donna Maree Robinson and featuring original botanic illustrations by local artist Kate Brunner, a range of all abilities artists and performers will collaborate to create this special digital animation, which will be projected on to the gallery's exterior walls, premiering during our birthday celebrations..

I'm so proud of the art gallery we've all been able to nurture and grow over the last twenty years. The success of Artspace Mackay is thanks to the unwavering support and dedication of our local arts community, and past and present staff and volunteers. We hope you enjoy all that we have on offer in 2023.

GLEN SKIEN Summer of the Seventeenth Doll

Foyer Gallery, Artspace Mackay

Whilst living in Mackay in the mid-2000s, print and artist book maker Glen Skien became interested in the Australian play 'Summer of the Seventeenth Doll' which debuted for the first time in Melbourne in 1955. Presented in the foyer gallery, Skien's series of the same name is a masterful rendition of Ray Lawler's play, which was considered by many as the first significant Australian theatre production depicting everyday life. In a series of twelve etchings Skien re-presents this iconic text in pictorial form.

Focus on the Collection GREAT AUSTRALIAN HOIST

Foyer Gallery, Artspace Mackay

Great Australian Hoist considers the way contemporary artists engage with the myth of Australiana. This playful compilation of work from the Mackay Regional Council Art Collection reconsiders early twentieth century iconographies that associated native flora, fauna and other built icons with distinctly European viewpoints, prompting a variety of conversations about the history, relevance and meaning of Australiana today.

DEANNA HITTI M is for Madraseh (School)

Foundation Gallery, Artspace Mackay

Lebanese-Australian artist book and print maker Deanna Hitti explores identity and visual misrepresentation themes in *M is for Madraseh (School)*. In an ambitious 156-panel installation, Hitti combines cyanotype and colour screen print to re-present exoticised visual portrayals of the East. Early nineteenth century French Orientalist imagery overlayed with text from a language text book in Arabic creates an interplay between object, figure and language. In doing so, Hitti deliberately interrogates the Western gaze, giving agency to the dualities that exist within her own cultural identity.







DYLAN MOONEY The Wall

Foyer Gallery, Artspace Mackay

Dylan Mooney will return to Artspace Mackay for its' twentieth birthday celebrations to create his second site-specific mural on the gallery's seventeen metre foyer wall. Extending on his recent advocacy for climate action, Mooney a Yuwi, Australian South Sea Islander and Torres Strait Islander man, will draw on his water connections to respond to rising sea levels and the impact on island communities.

TIME OF OUR LIVES

Foyer Gallery, Artspace Mackay

How do we mark time and special occasions?; and how do the seasons and nature help determine this? Artspace Mackay in partnership with Crossroad Arts will respond to these questions via a series of practical, all abilities, digital animation workshops. Collaborating with local creatives, participants will animate original artworks designed by Kate Brunner, guided by new media artist Donna Maree Robinson. *Time of Our Lives* presented in the foyer gallery includes the new original artworks created, alongside the collaborative digital animation. This digital animation will also be shown as a projection on the gallery's Gordon Street exterior throughout the exhibition period.







IN BLOOM

In Bloom showcases twenty years of growth of Artspace Mackay, focusing on Australian visual culture via botanical imagery. Through a lens of investigation, the way floral imagery is used by artists to convey and at times interrogate a range of issues — from the imagined utopia of life in the tropics to First Nations connection to country and culture is considered. Work from the Mackay Regional Council Art Collection and associated programs, including a new major birthday commission are featured in this celebratory exhibition.

FIRE AND ASH Woodfire Pottery of Arthur and Carol Rosser

Main Gallery, Artspace Mackay

For over forty years Arthur and Carol Rosser created work from their secluded rainforest pottery in the Mackay hinterland, near the township of Eungella, Queensland. Fuelled by an enduring fascination with the interplay between clay, wood and fire, the Rosser's working career saw them quietly gain national recognition for their dedication to the production of woodfired pottery. Bringing together a comprehensive body of work from the 70s – late 2010s, *Fire and Ash* celebrates the artists' expansive mastery of the medium. Highlighting their considered approach to land care, development of unique ash glazes and long wood firings, Artspace Mackay celebrates these prolific potters' careers as part of the gallery's twentieth birthday fete.
