

Artspace is getting ready to make some noise in the latter half of 2022. *Material Sound* is an original sound and kinetic touring exhibition featuring Australian artists at the forefront of sound experimentation. The exhibition brings together work by six art practitioners and collaborative groups, each creating an experience of sound within installations constructed from everyday materials. These highly engaging artworks expand our sense of how art is made, how it affects us, how we think about it and how we listen to our world.

Mackay artist Shelley Engwirda's exhibition *We Rise* examines the success and failures of the women's movement. Working across diverse media including patchwork quilts and glass, Shelley ponders the way female artists have been regarded historically and responds to major moments in the women's movement, from the 1970s to present day.

The Queensland Art Gallery | Gallery of Modern Art (QAGOMA) touring exhibition *Asia Pacific Contemporary: Three Decades of APT* delivers a riot of contemporary art to round out another jam-packed year. The exhibition features artworks commissioned or collected by QAGOMA over the life of APT. Since its inception in 1993, the *Asia Pacific Triennial (APT)* of Contemporary Art has featured some of the most exciting, inspiring, and important works from around Australia, Asia and the Pacific. *Asia Pacific Contemporary: Three Decades of APT* illustrates extraordinary social change over almost thirty years, making it an exhibition not to be missed.

We continue to encourage our youngest visitors to get noisy at the gallery during our free, monthly BMA Kidspace toddler art program. The monthly free BMA Kidspace concert which has been a feature of this public program since its inception, is popular with our little visitors and parents, and our staff and volunteers love it too! It is wonderful witnessing our smallest art lovers express themselves through art and dance.

## SHELLEY ENGWIRDA We Rise

Foyer Gallery, Artspace Mackay

Mackay artist Shelley Engwirda looks to the success and failures of the women's movement in *We Rise*. Inspired by her experience as new grandmother, Engwirda explores the way female artists have been regarded historically through her multidisciplinary practice. The artist's large scale patchwork quilts alongside glass work respond to what she considers major moments in the women's movement from the 1970s-present.

## NATHALIE HARTOG-GAUTIER Looking for Paradise

Nathalie Hartog-Gautier is a French-born artist based in coastal New South Wales. In *Looking for Paradise* Hartog-Gautier highlights Australia's responsibility as a first signatory of the United Nations Human Rights Charter. Bringing refugee experiences to the fore via artists' books' and digital animation (created collaboratively with Broken Yellow), Hartog-Gautier examines the treatment of asylum seekers in Australia.

# MATERIAL SOUND

Main Gallery, Artspace Mackay

*Material Sound* is a multi-form exhibition that draws together six art practitioners and collaborative groups, each creating an experience of sound within installations constructed from everyday materials. Handmade instruments and electronics, recycled components, outmoded technologies, fake technologies, imagined sounds, and silences are brought together to challenge the way we think about materiality in a cumulative sound experience. A Murray Art Museum Albury exhibition, curated by Caleb Kelly and presented nationally by Museums & Galleries of NSW. This project has been assisted by the Australian Government through the Australia Council for the Arts, its arts funding and advisory body.

Photography, sound, drawing and installation form *Echo Forest—The Eloquence of Trees* by central Queensland artist Veronika Zeil. Encouraging visitors to pause and contemplate human impacts on the environment, Zeil's multidisciplinary practice offers a window into what she identifies as fractured landscapes, focusing on the different growth stages of trees.


## D HARDING The Wall

D Harding is a descendant of the Bidjara, Ghungalu and Garingbal communities of Central Queensland. They work in a wide variety of media to explore the visual and social languages of their communities as cultural continuum. As artist in residence at Artspace Mackay, Harding continues their strong interest in textile and pigment. In recent times they have enjoyed making new wool felts and blankets, and exhibiting these with the colours of their Grandparents' territories.

## TALES OF THE LYRE BIRD

Main Gallery, Artspace Mackay

Across more than two decades from 1977 the Lyre Bird Press produced over 50 artists' books ranging from livre d'artiste luxury publications to experimental book forms, involving creators of all kinds. Drawing from the significant holdings of the Mackay Regional Council Art Collection, *Tales of the Lyre Bird* follows the important output of the press from its Melbourne conception by Tate Adams AM (b. 1922, d. 2018) to its reinvigoration in North Queensland in the early 90s.



Curated by Ron McBurnie and Helen Cole this major survey, highlights the collaborative works that were conceived via the press, including artists such as Tate Adams AM, George Baldessin, Anneke Silver, Ray Crooke and Juli Haas.

Nilofour Lovegrove's practice is heavily influenced by motifs from her Persian upbringing. Creating visual narratives that combine her central Queensland lived experience and Persian storytelling *Too Little, Too Much* focuses on water, and associations the artist draws with natural disasters including drought and flood.

Presented by Queensland Art Gallery I Gallery of Modern Art, *Asia Pacific Contemporary: Three Decades of APT* profiles key moments from the gallery's flagship exhibition series looking to contemporary art in the Asia Pacific Region. Works of art commissioned or collected from APT1 (1993) through to APT9 (2018-19, display APT's embrace of contemporary art in all its forms—from the ceremonial to the conceptual, and the deeply personal to the resolutely social.
